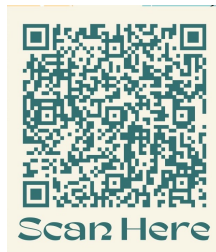

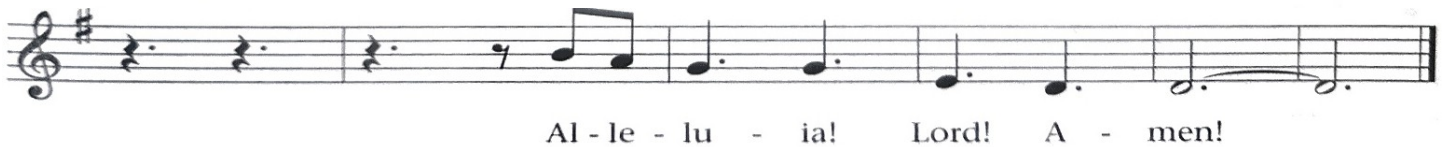

Black History Month at STRC - Today's worship includes music chosen to commemorate Black History Month, which began in 1926 to honor the too-often neglected accomplishments of Black Americans in every endeavor throughout our history. The month of February was chosen by its founder, Carter G. Woodson, to coincide with the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln (2/12) and Frederick Douglass (2/14). Each Sunday in February, we'll be singing gospel songs, spirituals, and/or works by African-American composers, and on Sunday 2/22, we'll offer a special service focused on STRC's own Edward Wilmot Blyden.
