Consistory Update:

The consistory has decided to enter into a 6-month lease for the Bakery Square space (concluding May 31, 2026). This is where our nursery and Children & Worship are held. We are assessing our current and future needs for space to accommodate our nursery, Children & Worship, and Children's Christian Education in light of our budget, current giving, and overall ministry priorities.

The consistory will be meeting Tuesday, September 16, and will have a congregational consistory update afterwards. STRC will have a congregational meeting in November 2025, the date is TBD.

Children and Worship & Sunday School Update:

Our Children and Worship Program (ages 3 through First Grade) will be starting this Sunday, September 14. This year, our teachers will have the full hour of worship with the children. **On Communion Sundays,** the first Sunday of every month, we will not have Children and Worship, but will instead plan multi-generational worship in the sanctuary and Children and Worship will not meet.

We are still working on plans for Children's and Youth ministry for grades 2-12. They will begin in October, exact dates TBD.
